## Who May Attend Wood Badge?

To attend a Wood Badge course, you must:

1. Be a registered member of the BSA. (Youth older than 18 may attend. They do not need to be registered in an adult leadership role.)
2. Have completed the basic training course for their Scouting position.
3. Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment.
4. Complete the Annual Health and Medical Record form, dated after August 19, 2011.

**Early Bird fee of \$200 received by June 1, 2012**  
**\$250 after June 1, 2012**

\$50 deposit due with application, balance due before June 1, 2012 for Early Bird discount.

**A limited Number of Wood Badge scholarships are available, contact the course director for information.**

## Course Size

The course will consist of at least 30 and not more than 48 participants and will be filled on a first come, first paid basis. The first 48 participants with all fees paid will be in the course.

## The Wood Badge Experience

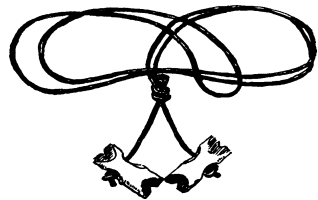

It is designed to give Scouters the tools they need to provide the highest quality scouting experience for the youth in their units.

It is based on contemporary leadership and team building concepts in use in American business, and is designed for Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, and Venturing leaders, as well as District and Council leaders.

***What training must I complete before the course begins?***

- \_\_\_ New Leader Essentials or This is Scouting
- \_\_\_ Intro. to Outdoor Leader Skills (required for Venturing Leaders and Scoutmasters. Recommended for other leaders.)



***What should I bring?***

You will be sent a "Welcome" packet when your registration and deposit is received which will include suggested items to bring.



***What about the BSA Physical?***

***What kind of activities can I expect?***

Our course is being held at a BSA Council camp. There will be indoor and outdoor activities in any weather which will include walking and active games. By the nature of the course, sleeping, classroom and activity areas are spread about.

You will be camping in tents in your patrol site and meals will be cooked for you the first part of the week. The later part of the week you will cook your own meals. Showers are available, latrines are situated near campsites. There will be limited laundry facilities available.
