What does it take to be a “Trained” Cub Scout Leader?

You must complete all of the following:

- Youth Protection (*Must complete every 2 years*)
- This is Scouting (*online training*)
- Leader Specific, for your registered position

While Cub Scout Leader Specific Training can be completed on-line at www.myscouting.org, some volunteers still prefer a personalized training session. This allows for your questions to be answered and the sharing of information with other leaders from around the council. The training for cub leaders is delivered in three sections. It begins with “Introduction to Cub Scouting” and “How We Have Fun” to teach the basics of cub scouting. The third section is designed for your position in the pack and teaches you how to deliver the program to the boys. If your registered position changes in the pack, as it often does, only the position specific third section must be completed to be trained for your position (begins 1.5 hours after start time.) These courses are:

- Tiger Cub Den Leaders
- Cub Scout Den Leaders and Assistants
- Webelos Den Leaders and Assistants
- Cubmasters and Assistants
- Pack Committee Chairmen and Members

Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)

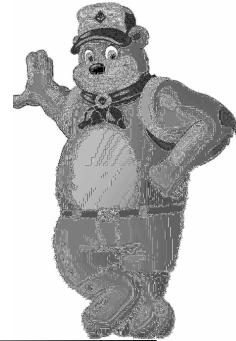

Registration deadline is April 6th. Registration fee is \$8.00 if paid by deadline. Please submit universal registration form to a Glacier's Edge Service Center. Fee after deadline is \$10.00

This is an 8-hour outdoor training course for all Cub Scout Leaders. This course is required for all Cub Leaders that want to engage in outdoor activities. Participants acquire the skills and confidence necessary to plan and carry out a successful Cub Scout level overnight activity and understand the focus of the Cub Scout level of the BSA.

At least one member of the Pack must be BALOO trained prior to a Pack being granted a tour permit and permission to conduct its own overnight campout. This person must be in attendance at the event.

Outdoor Leader Skills for Webelos Leaders (OWL)

Registration deadline is March 30th. Registration fee is \$20.00 if paid by deadline. Fee after deadline is \$25.00. Plan to arrive by 8:00 a.m. on Saturday morning. Those with farther to travel may arrive between 6:00 and 9:00 p.m. on Friday and stay overnight. Food will be provided at sundown on Friday. Training starts first thing Saturday morning and concludes Sunday early afternoon.

This fun-filled weekend training course is for all Bear and Webelos Leaders and those involved in delivering the Webelos program. Learn the skills necessary to successfully implement the Webelos outdoor program. Incorporating the adage "3/4 of Scouting is Outing", the course is conducted out-of-doors, rain or shine. Outdoor skills of Cooking and Sanitation, Campfires, Knots, Woods Tools, Naturalist, Forester, First Aid, Fire Building, Geologist, Outdoorsman, Selecting Campsites, Tents, Bedding and Weather are taught in the program. The emphasis is on **Hands-on** Training. It also prepares the leader to conduct Webelos overnight camping with the boys and parents of the den.

Leader Specific training for Webelos Leaders is recommended. Outdoor Leader Skills for Webelos Leaders is a supplemental training required to earn your Webelos Leader Training Award. Please register before the deadline so you can receive information necessary to prepare you for the weekend.
